Geneva Convention

A pact, which explains the difference between immigrants and refugees

Reasons to flee from a country

justified fear of persecution for

- Ethnical
- Religious
- Political reasons
- Due to their nationality
- Belonging to a certain social group

Migrants

- · Are not in danger of persecution
- Left there home country voluntarily in the purpose of
 - Work
 - Education
 - Personal reasons



Apply for asylum

After crossing the border:

- They have to apply for international protection
- Name the reasons, why they need help from Austria

The police

- Takes a picture of the refugee
- Writes down the personal data
- Takes fingerprints
- And asks a few questions

The basic care program

- health insurance
- Food
- · Pocket money
- Accommodation in suitable facilities

Unattended minor refugees

In the first part

- Right to special assistance
- At first, they are accommodated in Traiskirchen or other federal care facilities
- They get legally represented during their asylum proceedings

In the second part

• They get accommodation in special facilities for unaccompanied minors

Problems

Cultural problems

- Many wear a headscarf and do not eat pork
- More generations live in one house
- The average number of children is much higher
- Some refugees don't respect and assault women
- Many of them think, that homosexuality is immoral and should be punished
- Environmental protection
- Many refugees are illiterate
